Large and interesting Public Meetings in the interest of Home Missions and Bible Schools and of Foreign Missions, have been held on the evenings of the 12th and 14th during the continuance of the Yearly Meeting.

To the Yearly Meeting:

The Committee on Indian Affairs report:

The most encouraging features of the work carried on by them in conjunction with the Associated Executive Committee on Indian Affairs have been the increase in the number of Indians who have become members of the Society of Friends, and the extension of the field of the missionary operations of that Committee. In the Meetings attended by Indians, there have been a gain of 70 members of that race and of 30 white members during the year, and the total number of Indian members is now 229.

One preparative Meeting has been set up, making six in all. Beside continuing religious instruction at all the stations reported last year, Meetings are now held among the Squas in the Sac and Fox Agency.
