

52. As the Yearly Meeting is now to have but one Treasurer, Mary B. Nicholson, has been released from that service to the Women's Yearly Meeting, which she has performed to our entire satisfaction for a number of years.
53. The Committee on the distribution of funds was also released, the Yearly Meeting having authorized the Representative Meeting to appoint a Joint Committee of four Friends to attend to that duty.
54. The Committee on Correspondence produced Epistles to London, Dublin, New York, New England, North Carolina, Ohio, Indiana, Western Iowa, Canada and Kansas, which were read and approved, and the Clerk was directed to sign them in behalf of the Meeting and forward them.
55. An Epistle to the absent members was also read, and one to the children. The Meeting directed that five hundred copies of the letter to the children be printed, and two hundred copies of the one to our absent members Mary E. Carr, Annette Pope and Julia Winslow, were appointed to attend to the printing and distribution of these Epistles.
56. The Committee appointed to propose names of Friends to form a Committee on Peace, reported the following, which were approved by the Meeting. (See Minutes of Men's Meeting.)
57. The Minute of the Meeting on Ministry and Oversight was read and approved, and was directed to be read in Preparative Meetings of Ministry and Oversight. (See Minutes of Men's Meeting.)
58. Ella Geale and Mary L. Atkinson, were appointed to copy the Minutes of this Meeting. A number of Friends were named to copy the Epistles from other Yearly Meetings to be sent down to the Monthly Meetings.
59. The Representatives were called: all but three have been in attendance on the Yearly Meeting.

Then adjourned to meet at 11 o'clock to morrow morning for Divine Worship.
