

Patusant. - At Patusant there is no organized work, though some of our members are active in the cause.

Deer Creek. - Deer Creek reports eleven of the young women are members of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, and most of the young men are belonging to the State Temperance Alliance.

Bellefonte. - One public meeting was held at Bellefonte, addressed by David Paton. The prisons have been visited. Bible readings given, devotional services held, some pledges signed, and education is promoted through the distribution of Temperance literature.

Munings Creek. - Most of the members are actually engaged in Woman's Christian Temperance Union work. They have a Band of Hope, and several hundred pages of literature have been distributed. Joseph Morrison reports that he has distributed hundreds of Temperance tracts through Pioga, Centre, Clearfield and Jefferson Counties: while travelling, distributed Peace literature from house to house, notably the tract written by Joseph M. Leeds, entitled the "Silver Arrow," has been well received.

One meeting was held at Curwensville by David Paton, which was largely attended.

Richmond. - At Richmond most of the members are actively engaged in this work: several thousand pages of literature have been distributed; jails and almshouses visited, and Gospel meetings held.

Connetton. - Nearly all of the Friends are members of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, under whose auspices several meetings have been held, and some literature distributed.

Black Creek. - A regular organized Temperance meeting is held at Beva every month. Several hundred pages of Temperance literature distributed; also a public Temperance meeting is held at Bethel every month. Some Gospel Temperance meetings held there by Mr. Perry, and literature distributed.

Corinth. - At Corinth a Prohibition Club has been organized; ten public meetings held, and about two thousand pages of literature distributed. beside the regular Temperance

meeting held there each month.

Quite a number of Friends of Black Creek, Bethel and Beva are members of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, and are doing active work in that organization, of which we don't report here.

We believe the feeble efforts that have been made during the past year have been blessed, and we earnestly desire that greater efforts will be made the coming year for the advancement of this great cause.

42 Twenty-five dollars was appropriated for the use of the Committee on Peace, and our Treasurer directed to pay that sum to the Committee.

43 The following report of the Committee on a Conference of Yearly Meetings was read and approved, and the Committee continued to keep the subject under their consideration, and report again next year.
