

The five dollars sent us by the Committee was used for Amendment work. Our Meeting has no separate Society of its own; all that has been done, has been in conjunction with the H. C. S. M. of this place.

Cerinth. We have a Temperance organization of about 100 Members; Meetings held once a month. About fifteen or twenty engaged in tract distribution.

About 2500 pages of Temperance literature have been distributed: 20 Copies of "Youth's Temperance Banner" for one year, and 880 Temperance tracts, received from Yearly Meeting's Committee.

We believe the liquor traffic to be the most prolific source of crime in our Country, a standing menace to our civilization and one of the greatest hindrances to the spread of the Gospel. We therefore labor for total abstinence for the individual, and for absolute suppression of the sinful traffic.

The Treasurer's report, as follows, has been audited and found correct. The Committee recommend that \$400 be appropriated for its use this year.
