33 The following report, of the Committee on the subject of a united Executive Committee on Foreign Missions, was read, and approved by the Meeting. It is as follows:

Report of Committee on Proposition from Indiana Committee on Foreign Missions to the Yearly Meeting:

We have very carefully considered the proposition submitted on behalf of Indiana Yearly Meeting's Committee on Foreign Missions, for this Yearly Meeting to unite with Indiana, Western and New York Yearly Meetings in the direction and management of Friends' Mission work in Mexico, through an Executive Committee to be composed of twelve members, three from each of the Yearly Meetings.

We appreciate the liberality of these Committees in thus inviting this Yearly Meeting to join in the management of the work, with equal representation in the Executive Committee.

If our present connection with Foreign Mission work were confined to Mexico, we believe an arrangement of the kind proposed, somewhat modified as to the equality of representation, would be desirable; but under existing circumstances, with an interest alike in Mexico, Syria, and Japan, we are united in judgment that it will not be advisable for the

Yearly Meeting to accept the responsibility of management to which it has been so cordially invited.
