 meeting & that it be brought to a quarterly or monthly meeting for approbation  
 and to be signed in the behalf of this meeting: as also Divers Epistles from  
 the mens meeting in London was Read one from their yearly meeting in  
 the year 1714 and one from the meeting of women at Boston dated the 11<sup>th</sup> mo  
 one drawn by us in answer thereto and is approved and signed  
 by this meeting bearing Date of 8<sup>th</sup> of the fourth mo 1715 John Simeon Religious

from the monthly meeting of friends at Standstead dated the 20<sup>th</sup> of 4<sup>th</sup> mo 1715  
 was Read and also one from the Second days morning meeting of friends  
 in London: the Lord was with us in this our Great meeting as  
 we truly & intelligently waited upon him: blessed be his name for evermore  
 our meeting ended peaceably and was adjourned to usual time next year

At our Womens yearly meeting held at the meeting house at the head of  
 Tradehaven Creek of the 8<sup>th</sup> mo 1715 we being met together to wait upon  
 the Lord & Inquire into the affairs of truth relating to the severall meetings  
 belonging to this yearly meeting both Eastern & Western Shore
