This Meeting appoints Mary Hall, Sophia Galloway, and Rebecca Richardson to answer y<sup>e</sup> Epistle from the yearly Meeting in Burlington

An Epistle from Elizabeth Stevens was read and well approved of

Our friend Catherine Eaton from England, being here upon a religious visit, produced a certificate from y<sup>e</sup> Monthly Meeting where she belonged which was read and well accepted

An Epistle was read in this Meeting for Burlington yearly Meeting of women friends and to y<sup>e</sup> Satisfaction of y<sup>e</sup> Meeting which they signed

Ann Moore and Mary Brown are appointed to transcribe y<sup>e</sup> said Epistle and send it

This Meeting having gone through y<sup>e</sup> business it adjourns till y<sup>e</sup> next yearly Meeting to be held at Westover
