the minutes of this Meeting, through the western
Quarter, the two former to unite with the Quar-
terly Meeting on the Eastern Shore of Maryland
and that Quarter henceforth, to report to this
Meeting agreeable to the Conclusion of the
Yearly meeting for Maryland, and the
latter in like manner to unite with the
Quarterly meeting held in Baltimore, and to
become a Branch thereof, which we never the-
less submit to the yearly meeting —
