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" to propose to the Yearly meeting that this portion of our Members be
" again entreated, in the Language of affection, to desist from these
" practices, under a persuasion that the time is drawing near in which
" this precious Testimony must be supported by the disownment of
" those who obstinately persist, in opposition to the solid advice and
" judgment of the Body." —

" We also propose that the Yearly meeting repeat a caution to
" our Members against either grinding Grain for distillers, or
" selling it for distillation, or being in any manner concerned in
" the transportation of it, to, or from Market." —

" All of which was submitted to the meeting."
