

3^d own last year in contravention of the Discipline by which they profess to be governed closed the way to all labour and intercourse on the part of this Meeting with those Quarters. We therefore propose, however painful and affecting to our feelings the necessity may be, that the Yearly Meeting dissolve and discontinue these quarterly meetings and all the meetings subordinate to them. That the members who are within the compass of Warrington quarterly Meeting be considered as belonging to Nottingham quarterly meeting, and be held accountable to and under their notice and care. And that the members within the compass of Fairfax Quarter be considered as belonging to Baltimore Quarterly Meeting and be held accountable to and under their notice and care. We further propose that the Yearly Meeting appoint a committee to be in connection with committees appointed by these quarters respectively, whose duty it shall be to extend their labours & assistance to meetings, or to individuals within the compass of the quarters; and that

full liberty be given to them to collect together and settle individuals, who may be united to us, whether in the relation of elections for Worship or for Discipline, as the case may require, and that the due exercise of our precious and ~~valuable~~ invaluable discipline may be carefully and faithfully maintained in every branch of the Yearly Meeting.
