4th Summary.

Care is taken to maintain our testimony against distilled spirituous liquors, frequenting taverns and places of diversion generally avoided. Moderation and temperance mostly observed.

5th Summary.

The necessities of the poor have been inspected and relieved. No children amongst us requiring friends aid.

6th Summary.

Friends generally maintain

a testimony against an hireling ministry - and no deficiency is noticed in relation to the latter part of the query.

7th Summary.

Friends are careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances and no failure in the latter part of the query appears.

8th Summary.

With one exception our testimony against slavery appears to be maintained - those of the African race in friends families are provided for, and some care is taken to instruct them in useful learning.

9th Summary.

Mostly careful to deal with offenders agreeably to the requisitions of the query.
