Our testimony against Slavery (with one exception) appears to be generally maintained, those of the African race in friends families are suitably provided for, and receive some instructions in useful learning.

With the exception of a few cases of the Separatists, care is taken to deal with offenders seasonably, and impartially and to advise to those who will not be reclaimed, the spirit of meekness and love before they are disowned.

10th Summary,

Friends appear careful, as far as practicable, to place their children for tuition under the care of teachers in membership with us.
