Met pursuant to adjournment. The meeting entered upon the state of society as exhibited in the answers to the Queries and proceeded through them.

Concern was expressed that we should be more faithful in the attendance of our religious meetings in which a lamentable deficiency was reported.

Mothers were earnestly exhorted to great diligence in training up their beloved children for the service of the Lord and in adherence to our testimonies with regard to plainness, a fear being felt that a departure from this, may proceed from a root of pride in themselves; and minister to that pride in their children, which must be thoroughly subdued and broken down, before the lowly Jesus can reign in their hearts. We were encouraged to continue faithfully to bear our testimony against slavery, and a concern was felt that the
