A part of this Committee visited our Subordinate Meetings, and members, within the last year, as follows, In 10th Mo. last, Deer Creek Monthly Meeting, was visited by two of our number; in the 12th Mo, three of the Committee, attended Thompsons Creek Quarterly Meeting, and held a public mtg in Altona, and also at Belknap, in the same month: one of our number attended Deer Creek Monthly Meeting, a public meeting of first day, and visited many of the families, and another attended, just before the monthly meeting, their first day meeting, and had

an appointed meeting in Darlington, and also visited most of the families in that neighborhood.

In the 3rd Mo. two of our number, visited our friends in Charles County, Maryland, and held meetings with them and others. In the 8th Mo, one of our number held a public meeting at Deer Creek, and one at the house of John S. Williamson.

In the 5th Mo. three of our number, attended the Half Year's meeting, at Black Creek, and in the 10th Mo, one of the Committee, the same meeting, held at Richmond Va. In the latter part of the winter, one of our number, visited our friends at Abnashen, attended their Meeting, and held an appointed Meeting in the village of Bendersville. In the Spring three of our number, attended the Meeting at Washington, and two of the Committee attended the Meeting in Montgomery.
