Third Summary

We believe many Friends by example and precept endeavor to bring up their children, and those under their care, in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and to some extent in the plainness of speech, deportment and apparel which the Gospel enjoins. Some care is taken

to guard them against pernicious reading and from the corrupt conversation of the world, and they are encouraged to read the Holy Scriptures. But we feel that there is need for a more earnest Christian care in all these important particulars.

Fourth Summary

We believe most Friends maintain our testimony to a free Gospel Ministry, agreeably to our discipline.

Fifth Summary

We believe Friends are clear, so far as appears, with regard to the particulars queried after.

Sixth Summary

The necessities of the poor, and those requiring aid are inspected and relieved. They are advised and assisted when necessary in such employments as they are capable of. Some care is taken to provide for the school education of Friends' children.

Seventh Summary

We believe Friends are clear in regard to
