## Report on First-day Schools.

The reports from some of the Monthly meetings  
are so incomplete that it is impossible to  
give full statistics. We have reports from  
19 First-day Schools held an average of ten  
months in the year. The number of persons  
belonging to them, mostly children, is stated  
at 1116, and the average attendance 829.  
The increase is almost entirely in Baltimore  
Monthly Meeting, where a new school of 126  
children has been opened and another has  
grown considerably in the past year. Some  
of the Country Meetings are not as active  
in First-day School work as could be desired.
