to wait for divine ability.

ment of truth and the support of our
Discipline.
Ans. 4.th It appears that Ministers and Elders
are exemplary in uprightness, temper-
ance and moderation; and that they
endeavour to educate their children
in plainness of dress, and simplicity
of manners, becoming our religious profession.
Under the consideration of which, the respon-
sibilities and duties of the station, we felt
in the Church, have been ever more seen
and felt.
