"2nd As far as appears, Ministers in the exercise of their gifts are careful to wait for divine ability.

"3rd Ministers and Elders generally, are in unity one with another and with the Meetings to which they belong, manifesting a religious concern for the advancement of truth and the support of our discipline.

"4th They endeavour to be good examples in uprightness, temperance and moderation, and to educate their Families in plainness of dress and simplicity of manners becoming our religious profession.

In the adoption of which summary, our minds have been renewedly impressed with the weight of obligation which rests upon us, in relation to the duties we owe to ourselves, to one another and to the Church.

Then adjourned to 8 O'clock on Friday morning next.
