

Third. As far as appears Ministers and Elders are in unity one with another and with the Meetings to which they belong; and we trust they manifest a concern for the advancement of Truth and the Support of our Discipline.

Fourth. Ministers and Elders appear exemplary, in uprightness, Temperance, and moderation and we believe they are concerned to endeavour to educate their families in plainness of Dress and Simplicity of Manners becoming our Profession; but an increase of this concern and more care therein it is acknowledged would be profitable.

Having been favoured at this season to experience a degree of the overshadowing of Divine and Heavenly Good wherein a renewed concern has been felt that we might individually ~~endeavour~~ give increasing evidence of dedication and faithfulness in the discharge of the various duties of our Stations as Ministers and Elders in the Church, especially in regard to the diligent attendance of all of our meetings and in the Education of our dear children and those under our care, consistent with our Religious Profession; and no further business appearing to engage our attention, the meeting concluded to meet at the usual time next year if so permitted.
