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Ans. 3rd Friends are in unity one with another and with the Meetings to which they belong, manifesting a religious concern for the advancement of truth and the support of our discipline.

Ans. 4th We believe friends are good examples in uprightness, temperance and moderation & endeavor to educate their families in that plainness and simplicity which becomes our religious profession.
