Like those who come to Christ when he was manifested in the flesh, for his touch of healing, we also shall be found laying our burdens at his feet and renewing our strength.

Were we faithful to the Lord and free in our service, it would be impossible for us to delegate the arrangement or conduct of our meetings to any man, nor would any be willing to assume them.

The Query in the Discipline which admonishes us "to wait for and act under the ability which God gives," seems to forbid pre-arrangement in our meetings for worship. If this Query were really acted out, we need fear no failure.

Waiting on the Lord is a universal requisite ^{for} success, and no mere touch of one branch of the Church.

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A Christian is one who has entered upon a new life and action - who listens to hear and to obey what God says, and thus becomes strong in the Lord.
