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and stating they gave at that time an interesting account of their visit to Friends and others on the Continent, and that the report of their extended labors especially in Norway and Denmark was very encouraging.

They also produced a Minute from the Yearly Meeting on Ministry & Oversight held in London the 28th of 5th Mo. 1897 recording the thankfulness of Friends there, for the measure of strength granted our dear friends, during their prolonged, and often arduous labors in that country and on the Continent of Europe which have been owned of the Lord to the comfort of many - Also a Minute from Dublin Yearly Meeting of Ministers & Elders held in Dublin on the 4th of 5th Mo. 1897, stating the gospel labors of our dear friends in that Yearly Meeting were very acceptable, and regret was felt by many that they were unable to visit Ireland again.

This meeting has requested that they give an account of their visit

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at a joint session of the Yearly Meeting. The Representatives were requested to bring forward to the next session of this meeting the names of two Friends to act as Clerk and Assistant Clerk for the ensuing year. Then adjourned to 9 o'clock next 4th day morning.
