

Reports of the condition of our subordinate Meetings have been received and the following is a summary of them: -

Baltimore Quarterly Meeting reports: -

The various Local Meetings report encouraging conditions generally, though two Meetings have sent in no reports during the past year.

A helpful Ministry is spoken of in most localities, and some Meetings vocal service from the membership generally is mentioned as very encouraging. The importance of the pastoral work is dwelt on, & a desire expressed that each member shall meet the need, & realize the individual responsibility in this important duty.

Dunmings Creek Half Year's Meeting reports: -

That the Queries & advices have been read.

Their Meetings for worship have been held with a few exceptions on account of weather, sickness and death: many Meetings for Discipline have been omitted, they express sorrow for this. They believe some of their Members have a real concern for the welfare of the Church

& have grown in spiritual life & activity. One of their Meetings reports that their Meetings are rarely, if ever, held in silence; they attribute much of the spiritual life in their meetings to the part taken by Christians of other denominations who meet with them.

They speak of a live concern amongst them for the Salvation of Souls.

Virginia Half Year's Meeting reports: -

An increase in spiritual life & all their Meetings report a good attendance.

Black Creek says their midweek meetings are poorly attended.

All their meetings report the daily reading of the Scriptures in their homes.

Corinth reports 244 family visits paid the past year & Black Creek several cottage prayer meetings held.

Love & unity prevail amongst them.
