John N. Parker, in his visit to Virginia last month, visited Somerton Meeting on the 14th. On the evening of the same day he attended a meeting at the house of the high brother, John C. White, and on the 15th visited the home of Mr. White. On the day following he visited Blacks Creek, where he was taught by Nannie Lee, after which he attended a regular meeting for worship and Preparation, and was much interested in hearing the report of the committee on Home Mission work, visiting families, house, etc. The membership appears to be well engaged in work, visiting families, and in readings, cottage meetings, and districts.

On the afternoon of the same day he attended the Mission house at Beren.
