

At the regular meeting of the Executive Com^{ee} of the Seaside Meetings Pastoral Com^{ee} with co-operating Com^{ee} of Baltimore Monthly Meeting held 2nd mo 13. 1888 present 13 members.

The chairman being absent John Nicholson was chosen chairman for the evening. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Committee to prepare a report of the Federal Hill work to be presented at the next Baltimore Monthly Meeting not having performed the service it was continued & directed to report to the next monthly meeting.

The meetings were considered in the following order.

Baltimore The series of meetings at Eutaw st. meeting which opened on the 9th of last month was continued until the evening of the 20th. Two meetings were held daily except on 7th day - John S. Dorland Jr. was with us from the evening of the 10th & remained over first day the 22nd. The meetings were not so large as sometimes from various causes but were "times of refreshing" to those who were able to attend. A number have since expressed the comfort & help derived from the clear & interesting presentation of Gospel truths to which they listened during these meetings.

The after meetings have increased in attendance & interest during the past month.

The first day evening meetings have been small partly on account of the weather. Caroline E. Salbott has been present on first day & fifth day morning meetings during the past month. A children's meeting was held last first day afternoon which was small. James Jones of N. C. was present at the last monthly meeting.

Federal Hill A series of meetings was begun at Federal Hill on the 22nd of first month & is still in progress. Caroline Salbott has been engaged in service throughout all the meetings. The attendance began with about seventy five & has increased to one hundred & twenty five on week day nights about twice as many on first days except in stormy weather. To account has been taken of the number of professed conversions & renewals but it is believed that between thirty & forty have already been led to take a definite step of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ for pardon for past sins & for power to lead a Christian life. More than half the number are young people under twenty. Two of the adults converts were brought up in the Roman Catholic faith but visiting among Protestant relatives were induced to attend the meetings & finally to accept the truth as it is in Jesus.
