

At the regular meeting of the Executive Com^{ee} of the Yearly Meetings Pastoral Com^{ee} with Co-operative Com^{ee} of Baltimore Monthly Meeting held 4th mo 9th 1888 present Chairman & 21 members. John C. Thomas spoke of the Men's Bible Class in charge of Jos. B. Elliott. which

was doing much good. It now numbers about 21 members.

Hoboken The reports from this meeting are encouraging. The social meetings are continued to be held with great interest. It is intended to hold a series of meetings here at the time of the quarterly meeting & they wish members of the Baltimore meeting to be present. The attendance of their regular meetings was stated to be larger.

Lincoln Reports are encouraging, the meetings are kept up in interest & size. There is a growing ministry & the usual attendance on 1st Day morning is about 40 to 60.
