The Committee on Titles to Meeting House Properties, in accordance with their appointment by Minute of 11th month, 10th, 1906, report that they have made inquiries regarding the insurance on all the Meeting House properties within the limits of the Yearly Meeting, and present below in tabulated form the result of such inquiries:
