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At a stated meeting of the Permanent Board of Baltimore Yearly Meeting & Friends, held beneath month 8th, 1907. About two hundred were present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read.

The Committee on Titles to Meeting House Properties made the following report:

To the Permanent Board of Baltimore Yearly Meeting:

The Committee on Titles to Meeting House Properties report that as directed by minutes of the Board Feb. 1907, they communicated with the trustees of the Meeting House property not insured and urged on them the importance of having insurance placed on their properties promptly. As a result of these communications and with the understanding that one half of the premiums would be met by the Board, a policy of \$100,000 for five years was placed on the Baltimore Meeting House.

The trustees of Black Oak and Bethel Meeting Houses decided to insure these buildings and policies were here issued on the same.

No reply was received to communications regarding insurance on Cornith School house, and Hopewell and Fickertown Meeting Houses.

With regard to the titles of the properties the committee would again call attention to the fact that owing to the death of Zachariah McNamee, the sole trustee holding the Lurlineville Meeting House property, they were

advised by counsel that it would be necessary to have the new trustees appointed by the Court of Equity before the property would vest in them. As the legal proceedings would necessarily be expensive and the Friends there may not be willing to meet such expenses, the committee desire the advice of the Board as to further procedure.

It has been reported there are legal defects in the titles of three other properties which cannot be remedied except at considerable expense, but as no disturbance of possession seems likely to result from these defects, the Committee do not advise action at present.

The committee would be glad to have unmounted photographs (4 x 5 inches) of all the Meeting Houses for insertion in a book in which there are recording extracts from the deeds of the various properties.
