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It was also considered a better plan to accomplish the proper presentation of said Bill, that it be forwarded to the Committee on Congressional Legislation of the Five Years meeting with the request that its consideration be taken up by that Committee, and if the project meets with approval, that the Bill be placed in the hands of some suitable member of Congress with the recommendation of the Committee for its passage.

It was also deemed advisable to suggest to that Committee the propriety of sending out to the several Committees on State Legislation of the Five Years Meeting a request that the individual members of the respective committees urge upon their representatives in Congress the passage of the Bill.
