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At a called Meeting of the Permanent Board held at Baltimore at 8 A.M. the above date nine members were present.

(Minute #24) The Public Meeting, referred to in Minute #24 of the Yearly Meeting of 1911 was held previous to the Meeting of this Board and was participated in by the Committee of Balto. Yearly Mtg. and some members of the Yearly Mtg's Committee on Place.

(Minute #26) The Matter of Minute #26, Yearly Mtg. of 1911, Concerning the Interstate Traffic in Intoxicating Liquors was referred to John C. Thomas and John N. Parker for action thereon.

(Minute #50) John C. Thomas, Katherine M. Smith & Mrs. H. Morris were appointed to represent this body, co-operating with other bodies, to preserve the first day of the week as a day of rest and worship and to prevent any modification of our present Sabbath Laws, See request of Minute No. 50 Yearly Mtg. of 1911.

(Minute #6) The subject of Capital Punishment, Res. Min. #6 of Yearly Mtg. of 1910, + report of Committee at Mtg. of Eleventh Mo. 14th 1911, is hereby re-committed to the original Committee, viz; John C. Thomas, James Carey Jr. Miles White Jr.

Woodcar T. Fussell and Thomas MacFungil, 77 for such action as they think best as way may open for it.

The Chairman of the Yearly Mtg. Peace Committee, in a written communication, called attention to the threatened ~~restriction~~ ^{restriction} of military training in the Male High Schools of Baltimore City and asked our action in a protest to the same. John R. Cary, A. Morris Carey and John C. Thomas are appointed to have care of the matter, and to prepare and present to the proper authorities such protest if it seems necessary.
