At a Stated Meeting of the Permanent Board held this
date, at Baltimore, Twenty one Members were present.

The Committee on Titles to Meeting House
property made report, viz; Samuel R. Neave
made a verbal report of his visit and
information gained concerning the Curwensville
Meeting House. The Committee is instructed
to prepare and present a written report
at the next Meeting of the Board.

The Committee on Book-Making, Race-track Gambling,
etc; made report as follows, viz;

To the Permanent Board
Baltimore Yearly Meeting of Friends.

Your committee appointed in Eleventh Month
in reference to Gambling in connection with Horse
Racing would report that they framed and forwarded
to the Legislature at Annapolis the Minute urging
that a law be passed prohibiting all public gambling
in connection with horse racing in the State of
Maryland.

Two members of the Meeting served on the
Citizens Committee which brought the evil under
consideration. The movement was under the direction
of the Social Service Committee of the Inter-Church
Federation, and an earnest attempt was made to express
the attitude of the religious community.

Up to this time final action has not yet
been taken by the Legislature.
