BALTIMORE YEARLY MEETING OF FRIENDS

To the Officials in charge of the
PANAMA-PACIFIC EXPOSITION to be held
at San Francisco in 1915:

Gentlemen:

We desire to call to your attention the necessity for giving to the world positive assurance that adequate measures are to be taken to protect the City and the visitors who come to the Exposition from the demoralizing influences of the evil-minded who would use such an occasion for vicious purposes.

We think there is no doubt that the vast majority of the people of the country prefer clean rather than evil conditions; so that vigorous action is demanded not only by moral considerations, but worldly wisdom would dictate such measures as would attract the larger number of people.
