TO THE PERMANENT BOARD OF BALTIMORE YEARLY MEETING:

Your committee appointed to co-operate in efforts to abolish
race-track gambling in the state of Maryland would report that an effi-
cient organization is being formed which proposes to enlist the efforts
of persons in all the counties of the state in behalf of this reform,
looking forward to the meeting of the legislature in 1918. We shall,
