of Maryland would report that they have carried out the
purpose of their appointment to the best of their ability.
Although a well organized committee of citizens of Maryland
was formed and an executive secretary employed to direct
its activities, we regret to have to report again that the
efforts to remove this great evil have failed, the Legisla-
ture having defeated the bill which was prepared with great
care and which at one time seemed to offer considerable
hope of passage.

In view of the fact that two years must elapse
before further efforts can be made in this direction, we
would suggest that the committee be released.
