A Meeting, Called at the request of five Members of the Permanent Board of Balto. Yearly Meeting of Friends (Orthodox), was held First Month, 20th, 1921, at which 127 (two hundred) members were present.

The report of the Yearly Meeting's Committee on co-operation with the committee of Balto. Church Int. Park Ave. and Laurens St. to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the establishment of Baltimore Yearly Meeting of Friends was received and approved, as follows =

Dear Friends:

Your letter asking our Yearly Meeting to co-operate with you in the observance of the 250th Anniversary of the establishment of Baltimore Yearly Meeting, was received with much satisfaction, and the meeting was united in directing most cordial acceptance of the invitation.

The Permanent Board was asked to communicate this official action to your Yearly Meeting, and to appoint a Committee to act with yours in making arrangements for the commemoration of this important event in the history of our Society.

The Board welcomes this opportunity for co-operation, which seems to emphasize the spirit of unity that exists in our meetings, and which we hope will constantly increase.

At our Yearly Meeting, reports from several subordinate Meetings indicated a spirit of co-operation among the young people of both branches of the Society that was most gratifying. The reports elicited expressions of unity from the members of the Yearly Meeting, and the young people were encouraged to foster such co-operation in service and worship.

Reports from the London Conference were also received at our Yearly Meeting with much interest. The fact that such a great gathering of Friends could unite in the consideration of matters so vital to the welfare of our Society made a deep impression upon us. It is our earnest hope that the two branches of the Society in America may find so much in common that united efforts may be multiplied, and that together we may fulfill the words of the Apostle to the Church at Ephesus, "with all lowliness of mind and unselfishness, and with patience, bearing with one another lovingly, earnestly striving to maintain in the uniting bonds of peace the unity given by the Spirit."
