The following report from the Committee on Race-track gambling was received, viz:

Baltimore, March 25th, 1922

To the Permanent Board:

The Committee on Race Track Gambling would report, that the result of the proposed Anti-Race Track gambling legislation in Maryland, is still uncertain.

The Bill passed the House of Delegates by a large majority and has been, within the past week, reported favorably by the Senate Committee with certain amendments to postpone its going into effect until June 1st, 1923.

There is still strong opposition to its passage, in any shape, based primarily upon the loss to the State of Maryland of the \$700,000 annual revenue from the Race tracks, but your Committee is assured by William Silver, who is working in Annapolis for its passage, that there will be a majority for the Bill when it is reached for final action.
