Yearly Meeting but that the legal steps necessary and Court proceedings were very slow. The Committee was encouraged to complete the transaction and order on the Treasurer for the necessary expenses. Not to exceed \$200⁰⁰. The Committee reported sale of Elkhorn Valley Meeting property for \$1500⁰⁰. Two hundred of which is now in their hands and the remainder expected at an early day.

The Clerk is instructed to sign any documents deemed necessary in the transfer of the Bellefonte property.
