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The Stated Meeting of the Permanent Board of Balto. Yearly Meeting of Friends (Orthodox) was held at Baltimore, Md. Third Month, 29th, 1924.
(19) Nineteen Members were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read & approved.

The Committee on Title to Meetinghouse property reported as follows, viz;
Dear Friends: Your Committee to whom was referred the matter of the sale of the Elkhorn Valley Meetinghouse, report that they have sold the Meetinghouse and Contents to the North Fork and Elkhorn West Va. Methodist Episcopal Church South for the Sum of \$1500.00 Cash. So as to avoid delay and expense of getting a decree from Court permitting the sale, we took advantage of a clause in our deed which said that at any time the house ceased to be used for a place of worship the property was to revert to the Crozer Land Association and Upland Coal and Coke Co.; So we executed a deed releasing the property to them and deposited it with the First National Bank of North Fork. The said Crozer Land Assn

giving the Methodist Episcopal Church a new deed similar to our old deed, the Bank delivering the deeds upon receipt of \$1500.00 paid in to our Credit. This was done.

The money has been handed over to Richard J. White, Treasurer of Balto. Yearly Meeting, and he reports having deposited it where it draws interest subject to the Order of the Trustees of Balto. Yearly Mts.

Our Committee feel satisfied with the sale as Balto. Yearly Mts. only subscribed \$805.00 towards building the house.

The transfer of the Title and writing of the deeds &c has been done without any expense.
