 "that we heartily approve the action of the President of the United States in declining his endorsement to combining the Celebrations of Armistice Day and Defense Day, on November 11th; And at the same time we desire to protest against any Celebration of Defense Day, because in these days when the United States is seeking to give emphasis to Goodwill among the Nations, any gesture that may be interpreted as our desire for the continuance of War preparations, is out of place!"
