It should be noted that the property is now under lease to the School Board of the borough of Curwensville for a period of five years, which lease has been turned over to Baltimore Yearly Meeting and its transfer also noted on the face of the deed given by the trustees. The Committee has had the lease recorded, and acknowledged, and the only matter yet to be attended to is to arrange with the School Board to receive the property at the expiration of the lease.

It may be noted that the School Board is to keep the property in repair during the term of lease, and also that the furnace and one toilet installed for school purposes are not to be removed at the expiration of the lease.
