The stated meeting of the Permanent Board of Baltimore Yearly Meeting (Orthodox), was held at Homewood meeting house, Baltimore, on Thursday 31st, 1928.

Twelve members were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

By appointment of the yearly meeting minute 30, the following friends are to serve on the Board until 1932, John C. Brodhead, Sallie P. Brooke, John R. Cary, Modcai T. Russell, T. Philip Rufford, Edith S. Silver, and Joseph M. Beatty Jr.

The Committee on Titles reported offers of \$2,000.00 for each of the meeting house properties at Curwensville and Bellefonte; the Board directed that the offers be accepted, and the matter was left to the trustees of the yearly meeting to consummate. The Committee reported that the adverse claim to part of the graveyard at Bellefonte was being investigated. The Board appointed George Valentine to look after the graveyard at Bellefonte for the yearly meeting. The Committee also reported that the property known as the school house lot at Conowingo had been deeded to trustees appointed by Councils Monthly Meeting.

Also as W. G. Clark was added to the 183 Committee on Titles.

In accordance with minute 30 of the yearly meeting, the question of Capital Punishment was considered. Sarah H. Hope reported that a bill in the Virginia House of Delegates, abolishing it, had failed in Committee, but that considerable interest had been aroused. The Clerk reported that a telegram had been sent to Edward P. Rufford requesting him to attend the hearing on the bill for the yearly meeting, in accordance with instructions of an informal meeting of certain members of the Board. It was reported that he had been unable to attend. Further action on the question was deferred until next yearly meeting. The Clerk reported the following insurance carried by the respective meetings.
