The stated meeting of the Permanent Board of Baltimore Yearly Meeting of Friends (Orthodox) was held at Homewood Meeting House, Baltimore, Md. on kind month 30, 1929.

Fourteen members were present.

The minutes of the two previous meetings were read and approved.

By appointment of the Yearly Meeting, minute 27, the following Friends are to serve on the Board until 1933, J. Hoge Riches, Joseph L. Haris, T. James Hunter, A. Morris Carey, Sara H. Hoge, Mary O. Reeve, Thomas W. G. Clark, and Edmund C. Stanton is to serve until 1932.

The clerk reported that the trustees of Corinth Monthly Meeting had been told of the suggestion of the Board that fire insurance be put upon the Dormitory at Corinth.

The Committee on Titles reported the completion of the sale of Bellefonte meeting property for \$2,000, and the delivery of the money to the Yearly Meeting Trustees. The Trustees were authorized to pay the expenses involved in getting possession of and transferring the property from the income that may be received from the investment of the \$2,000. - The committee was authorized to proceed with the clearing of

the title on the graveyard plot lying 189 without the brick wall.

The Committee on Titles appointed Ebenezer month 10th, 1898, were released, and the appointment of the present Committee on Titles, consisting of Miles White, Jr., Lewis C. Moon and Thomas W. G. Clark, was confirmed.

The attached report on insurance carried by each Monthly Meeting was read. The clerk was directed to enquire of J. John Joliff the amount of insurance carried by Hopewell. The clerk was directed to suggest to the trustees the increasing of their insurance in view of the addition to their meeting property.

The attached report of the Washington Benevolent Association of Washington, was read and approved.

The clerk was directed to forward the letter from George N. Hartley of Mountain City, Indiana in regard to the abolition of capital punishment to the Yearly Meeting for appropriate action.

Lewis C. Moon was directed to secure some new copies of the Discipline, and to draw on the Treasurer of the Yearly Meeting for the sum of \$50.00 or as much thereof as may be needed, for the same.
