The stated meeting of the Permanent Board of Baltimore Yearly Meeting of Friends ^(at London) was held at Hornewood Meeting House, Baltimore, Md., on Tenth month twenty-seventh at seven p.m., twelve members being present.

The term of service of J. Hoge Ricks, Caleb Winslow, Joseph L. Hare, Sara H. Hoge, T. James Hunter, Mary O. Reeve, and Thomas W. Y. Clark having terminated, the Clerk was instructed to give notice of this fact to the yearly meeting.

A. Viola Horisberg on behalf of the Committee on Records reported receipt of the following:-

A. Viola Horisberg read a letter from the

...Virginia State Library²¹³ stating that our Meeting is being charged fourteen cents a print, which is the actual cost for making photostats of our records. The librarian concluded the letter by stating that the originals should be brought to the Virginia State Library, preferably by some safe conveyance, if some one known to the Meeting is going to Richmond. Thomas W. Y. Clark reported the sum of \$248.⁸⁰ on hand for use ~~of~~ the records, and A. Viola Horisberg said that she would send the Cedar Creek records to Richmond next, probably in the spring. She made mention of certain records pertaining to Deer Creek Meeting, which are said to be in possession of some one in Harford County, Maryland. The Board requested her to investigate further.
