Our brethren of Ohio and Indiana Yearly Meetings who are associated with us in this work of benevolence, and to whose active attention it has been confided, have, in prosecution of the concern, evinced a patience and zeal which affords to us entire satisfaction, and while there remains a prospect that any future exertions on behalf of this suffering and injured people can be useful, we feel full confidence that every opportunity which may offer will be improved, for rendering them such aid and instruction as will be consistent with the trust reposed, and the means placed at our disposal.
