

Yearly Meeting held last year, was introduced, and read viz:

"At a Yearly Meeting of Friends, held in Baltimore for the Western Shore of Maryland, and the adjacent parts of Pennsylvania and Virginia, on adjournments from the 31st of the 10th month, to the 13th of the 11th month inclusive, 1831.

2^d of the month and 4th of the week.

The following extract from the will of the late Sarah Lane, was produced, and referred to the attention of the committee on Indian concerns, and when the bequest is obtained, it is the judgment of the meeting, that it be paid over to Joseph King, Junior, treasurer of that committee.

Extract

"I give to my executor the sum of one thousand dollars, to pay to the treasurer of the committee appointed by the Yearly Meeting of Friends held in Baltimore, for the transaction of the relief and benefit of the Indians, that the said Yearly Meeting, with the Yearly Meeting of Friends held at Mount Pleasant, in the State of Ohio, hath under their care towards civilization, having the tribe of Tugcarowas first in view, if to be found in two years."

Extracted from the minutes of the meeting above and by (signed) Hugh Balderson
Clerk to the Meeting this year"

which was referred to the consideration of the next meeting of the committee.

Then adjourned to meet on 5th day evening - at 7 o'clock, on the day of the Quarterly Meeting in the 3^d month next.

At a meeting of the Committee on Indian concerns, held the 15th of the 3^d month 1832.

Five members present.

Elisha C. Barrow was appointed to serve this Committee as clerk.

The Friends appointed to aid certain Indian Chiefs, of the Shawanese nation, in their application to Congress for relief, on account of the departure from a preliminary arrangement for a Treaty, as proposed by the commissioner on the part of the United States, and reported to by the Shawanese Indians, reported, that they had commenced a correspondence with several members of Congress on the subject, but were not prepared to report more fully at present. They were continued.

The communication received from the Baltimore Yearly Meeting, relating to a bequest made by the late Sarah Lane for "the relief and benefit of the Indians that the said Yearly Meeting, with the Yearly Meeting of Friends in Ohio, hath under their care," again claiming the consideration of the committee, it was concluded to
