The Friends appointed to aid certain Indian Chiefs, of the Shawanese Nation, in their memorial to Congress, were again continued

The Friends appointed in the case of Sarah Lane's Will, reported, that they had received no further information on the subject of their appointment - they were continued

Adjourned to meet on 2^d day evening at 7 o'clock - on the week preceding the Yearly Meeting in 10th month next

The Friends appointed in first month last, to aid certain Indian Chiefs, of the Shawanese Nation, in their memorial to Congress, made the following report, which

was accepted, and they released, viz^t

The Committee appointed to aid the Indian Chiefs of the Shawanese Nation, in their application to Congress for relief, in relation to the provisions of the treaty for the cession of their lands at Wapaghkonnetta: Report, That immediately after our appointment, we addressed a letter to several members of Congress, expressing of the interest felt by the Society here, in common with Friends of Ohio and Indiana Yearly Meetings, in behalf of the Indian Nations, a copy of which accompanies this report.

We have ascertained from authentic public documents, that the treaty has been ratified, and that subsequent to this ratification, an Act was passed by Congress, going to secure to the Indians under notice, an annuity of 2000 dollars per annum, for 15 years, as an additional compensation to them, for their property at Wapaghkonnetta.
