Dear Friends

Agreeably to your request we undertake to give you an abstract of our proceedings, in some time past, for your information. We do not now know to what period our retrospect ought to extend, but presume, that by commencing the narrative in 1827, we shall thereby embrace the principal occurrences, with which you are not already acquainted.

At the time alluded to, we were, with our friends of Indiana, engaged in extensive operations, by opening the farm, on the purchase we had made near the Indian reservation at Wapahkonnittu, and establishing or supporting a school for the instruction of the Indian children. At this time but a
