Mount Pleasant Jan 19. 1833

Dear Friends

We lately received a letter from a deputation of the committee of Indiana Yearly meeting, who have been appointed to visit the Shawanese at their new residence beyond the Mississippi, and as the approbation of the government must necessarily be had before they proceed in their contemplated embassy, we have prepared the enclosed communication to the Secretary of War, and request if it meet your approval, that you will attend to having it presented to him, with such statements or explanations as you may think proper to make, illustrative or confirmatory of the legitimacy of our communication, and forward to us his reply as soon as convenient, as the time when they propose to set out on their journey will not now admit of much delay.
