

At a meeting of the Committee on Indian Concerns held at 10 m. 27. 1834

Present Seven members

The friends appointed relative to the request of the late Sarah Fane inform that the case is still pending in the Courts of Pennsylvania. They are continued.

Hugh Balderson Jr. King and David Cobb are appointed to prepare an answer to the communication received from friends in London and read at our meeting in the 8th month, and requested to produce the same to our next meeting.

We have received and read at this time a copy of the report of the Committee of Ohio to their yearly meeting in which they recognize the views expressed by us in relation to the plan for the future proceedings of the joint committee: and from their proceedings the subject appears to engage their attention with increasing interest.

It also appears that some apprehensions are entertained that the Shawnees may suffer during the ensuing winter from want of provisions, and that the yearly meeting of Ohio have authorized their Committee to make an appeal to their monthly meetings for aid if it shall be found that the call

upon their humanity shall become urgent.

The friends appointed at last meeting produced the following report to the Yearly meeting which was approved and directed to be signed by the Clerk in behalf of the Committee, viz:

"To the Yearly meeting now sitting.

The Committee on Indian concerns report:

that during the past year they have endeavored to give such attention to the objects of their appointment as occasion required and as circumstances would permit.

And that the yearly meeting may be more fully acquainted with the proceedings of the Committee, they present the meeting with the record thereof since their report last year."

Adjourned to meet at 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the day of next Saturday quarterly meeting, at the house of Joseph King Jr.
