173 At a meeting of the Committee on Indian
Concerns held Nottingham 3rd Mo. 1835.

Present seven members: - The friends in
aid of late Sarah Jane, request are contin-

munication from Wm Allen and other friends
of London are continued.

Indian concerns appointed by Nottingham yearly
meeting of Friends have directed the annexed
communication (from the Committee West at Ohio)
to be forwarded to thee with a request that the
conclusion of the department in relation thereto
may as early as convenient be transmitted to
this Committee. It was also suggested that
inquiry should respectfully be made whether the
appointment of Blacksmith for the benefit of the
Shawnee is now filled, and in case a vacancy
should exist whether it would probably be agreeable
